Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Commission – President Report

Richard Easley, President



This is a summary of the Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Commission's performance report for the fiscal year of 2013, beginning March 1, 2013 and ending February 28, 2014.

Our budget year 2013-2014 was again one of many challenges. However, at the close of the year, our organization came through and finished on a high note, with our budget and countless other highlights for the program.

The fiscal year 2013-2014 was a very tough year for our SAFE program. Harold Hollingsworth, Assistant Chief for the Fort Osage, Missouri Fire Protection District was killed in the line of duty in April 2013 responding to a fire call. Anytime we have a line of duty death is a very difficult year for us. Financially the program did very well and received over \$100,000 raised by outside fundraisers, which shows the interest the program has in the community. The SAFE Program continues to be there for our public safety family when tragedy strikes.

Our Metropolitan Community Service Program continues to provide a valuable resource in our neighborhoods. The labor cost savings throughout the metro area was over \$1,000,000. Since the year 2000, we have over 1.5 million hours worked and have served more than 100,000 clients.

The Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Stoppers Program continues to be regarded as one of the best in the world. A total of 4,148 tips were taken in the calendar year 2013, with 226 fugitives arrested and 302 cases cleared. Our very own Detective Kevin Boehm was presented the National Coordinator of the Year Award for Crime Stoppers USA in 2013. As always, the Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Stoppers sets the standard very high for this special program.

Second Chance continues to make a huge difference in the area of ex-offender re-entry. Our program has served over 2,000 clients since the beginning of our Risk Reduction Program in 2010. Our recidivism rates continues to hold steady at less than 20% for those that satisfactorily complete the program within one year. The relationships built with law enforcement, civic organizations, faith based community, Non-Profits and Corrections have paid big dividends in our efforts to impact public safety and the high cost of incarceration.

Fighting crime is a team effort and we are very proud of our great staff and Board of Directors, who professionally go about trying to make a difference and fight crime in the greater metropolitan Kansas City.

2013- Onward With Decade Three...

On the heels of a successful 30th Anniversary year in 2012, the Greater Kansas City Crime Stoppers TIPS Hotline continued its progress into 2013.

At the Crime Stoppers USA National Conference in Grand Rapids, Michigan in August 2013, the program received a Media Award for "Best Print Publication" for our Kansas City's Most Wanted newspaper, and a Media Award for "Best Radio Crime of the Week," in conjunction with 710AM/103.7FM, Lt. Kelli Bailiff and The Radio Dish. Additionally, I was honored to be named Coordinator of the Year.

Statistically, our program has increased its numbers over 2012 in total TIPS received, arrests, cases cleared and homicides. Our aforementioned **Kansas City's Most Wanted** paper finished the year credited with 369 total fugitive arrests since inception.

September saw the 1st Annual Red Friday fundraising event downtown for Crime Stoppers. This event was created, and organized entirely by Joni Cross-Zakovich, daughter-in-law of Ray Zakovich, and featured nearly 1,000 attendees and brought in almost \$5,000 for the Crime Stoppers program.

We were honored by Ferrellgas as they introduced their newest "community bobtail" vehicle named "Amber" in memory of Boyd McGathey's daughter. This vehicle can be seen delivering propane and contributes \$10,000 to \$12,000 annually to Crime Stoppers, based on delivery volume.

Our Golf Tournament and Party at Arrowhead events continued to support the program by raising a combined \$100,000+ thanks to the committees and attendees who work so diligently in the name of this worthwhile cause.

The annual TIPS/Metropolitan Police Chief's and Sheriff's Association essay winners were also announced. From Kansas, Ms. Christie Fangman, Olathe Northwest High School, won and is attending the University of Kansas. On the Missouri side, Ms. Audrie Estrada, Liberty High School, was our winner. Audrie is also attending the University of Kansas.

Metropolitan Community Service Program

MCSP ended 2013 on a positive note with benefits to the entire metropolitan area. Total hours worked in 2013 surpassed 50,000. Our community and non-profit worksites depend on MCSP for the success of their own programs. Organizations such as Harvesters Food Network, KCKS Cross-lines, Metropolitan Lutheran Ministries, Hillcrest Thrift Stores, and Lee's Summit Social Services could not assist as many participants without the community service provided by MCSP.

MCSP neighborhood clean-up programs have removed over 400,000 pounds of litter from area streets in 2013! This litter would still be blowing around our community without this vital program. A significant impact can be seen in the downtown Kansas City, Kansas area. There was a 40% increase in the number of clients assigned to clean-up activities as a result of a 2013 grant provided by Greater Kansas City LISC. We must also give credit to Jackson COMBAT for their support for the Adopt Prospect worksite. MCSP realized an 86% success rate from those participating in the life skills course provided to our clients. Both LISC and COMBAT have renewed the grants for 2014.

MCSP Caseworker Glenda Russell was this year's MCSP Blue Hills Youth Program Coordinator. She did an excellent job working with 26 youth from that neighborhood, which included community service projects at the neighborhood's community garden, doing neighborhood block clean-ups and volunteering at Harvesters Food Network.



MCSP can be relied on by KC Municipal's Housing Court to help out older defendants of neighborhood preservation code violations. The 2013 summer project was to remove an old 200' Kentucky coffee tree threatening a neighbor's house.

Thanks to MCSP Supervisor Wendy Steinhaus' coordination efforts, the owner is no longer in violation and MCSP clients had an opportunity to participate in a unique positive work experience to "Help Our Community."

We also had a home paint project on Campbell that was finished, so MCSP is using the workers assigned to it by the courts to help make our neighborhoods a better place for residents and businesses therein, a safer place as well.

For the second fiscal year in a row, we lost a public safety officer to a line of duty death. On April 7, 2013, Assistant Fire Chief Harold Hollingsworth of the Fort Osage, Missouri Fire Protection District was killed while responding to a fire scene. His death was the eleventh time we have lost a public safety officer since the inception of the SAFE program on October 30, 2003.



Our Life Membership goal of 100 Life Members increased by 8 this year, for a total of 47. New members include Boyd McGathey, Ferrellgas, Zona Rosa Community Foundation, Financial Counselors, Inc., Tom Gresham, Judy Overton, Dave Bova with KC 9-11 Stair Climb, Jesse Weber of Jim Beam Brands Co. and Tom Van Buren of Ferrellgas.



This was a great year for fundraisers with a total of 12, which raised a total of \$101,300 for SAFE. One recurring one, Guns'N'Hoses, has a new venue this year, the Grand Ballroom of Battle Hall. Again, it was a huge success thanks in great part to Title Boxing and all of our behind the scene workers.



Financially we had another good year. After all expenses, the fund was increased this year by \$60,751. This brought the total SAFE account to \$690,732. Plans are underway to increase benefits to our families in all areas. This will occur during our next fiscal year.

We again awarded one \$2500 college scholarship and a recommendation has been made and approved to increase both the amount of the scholarship and the member awarded beginning also next fiscal year.

As we remember all fallen public safety officers and especially those families SAFE has helped, please continue to offer donations to help further our mission, and never forget, "All give some. Some give all."

Second Chance Program

The public safety and recidivism reduction work of the Second Chance Program (SCP) is ongoing; to help former offenders successfully reintegrate back into the community and workforce of Greater Kansas City after prison. Since the SCP Risk Reduction Center was launched in August 2010, over 2,000 individuals have received reentry resource information and direct services to finding employment, housing, maintaining sobriety, and reconnecting with family.

We are pleased to announce the election results of this year's annual meeting. Marilyn Scafe assumes the SC Board Chair, replacing Bailus Tate who will continue as an active member. Karen Phillips assumes the vice chair from Chief U.S. District Judge Fernando J. Gaitan, Jr., and Jackson County Prosecutor, Jean Peters-Baker was elected to a subsequent one year term as board secretary. We are also pleased to welcome three new board members: William M. Courtney, Financial Counselors Inc. (FCI), Clint R. Jones, Burns & McDonnell, and Charles Wunsch, SVP, Sprint.

The Second Chance Advisory Board has taken on two major projects for this year to further our mission and vision. A Strategic Review Committee is being chaired by Ms. Victoria Barnard and is determining the immediate and future long term direction of the program.

Also, the Fundraising Committee, co-chaired by Steve Brown and Rick Easley, is directing an event for September 2014. The "Border Showdown" will be a Metro-wide law enforcement firearms proficiency competition between Kansas and Missouri sworn officers. The Kansas City MO Police Department Training Academy is co-hosting the event and collaborating in the planning. Portions of the net proceeds will be designated for SCP expanded services beyond KCMO Jackson County; including Clay and Platte Counties, and local Kansas communities in the Metro Area.

Second Chance participated in the 2013 Missouri Reentry Conference held at Tan-Tar-A Resorts, Osage Beach, MO on November 20th-22nd. Barry Mayer, KCMCC Vice President, by special request of the Missouri Department of Corrections, was a panelist who discussed successful program models funded through its Missouri Reentry Project and the MRP Housing

Program. He attributed the positive results of the Second Chance Program to the cooperative relationship between MO Probation & Parole personnel and the dedicated staff of the SCP Risk Reduction Center. Barry made a strong case for Second Chance's continued funding for sustainability and programming expansion wrap around reentry services for Greater Kansas City.

Barry Mayer and SCP Director, Ron Smith, also offered a well received presentation regarding "Offender Mentoring: What Works?" The Session offered a practical look at what works in most cases when mentoring offenders with an evidenced model. Mentoring was examined within the framework of human relationships that facilitate the "change process" through traditional faith-based (religious) means or by structured cognitive/pro-social behavior training.

SCP Director Ron Smith was invited in early December to be one of a team of four persons engaged in a 10 day Prison Mission trip to Liberia (West Africa). This was a cooperative effort between KCMCC, the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, KS; ALPHA Prison Ministries USA; ALPHA International at Holy Trinity Brampton Church in London, England, and the United Methodist Church (UMC) of the Republic of Liberia. During the mission, the team had the privilege to meet briefly with Madame President Ellen Johnson-Sirleaf (2011 Nobel Peace Prize co-recipient) and former British Prime Minister Tony Blair. While there, the team visited prisons and had discussions with local law enforcement and the UMC of Liberia on possible ways of addressing exorbitantly high crime and incarceration rates; as well as possible recidivism reduction efforts.
